APPLICATION DUE IN THE GUIDANCE OFFICE BY APRIL 1ST

He believed that some type of vocational or college education was essential.

Application guidelines:

- * Applicants must have attended Murray Community High School for two complete years including their senior year.
- * Applicant will pursue education in an agricultural, health related, or construction related field; e.g. construction or agricultural engineer, ag systems technology, ag business, nursing or research related field in this area, vocational carpentry, mechanics, electrical, welding, or others upon committee approval.
- * Applicant must plan to attend a vocational program, two year or four year college/university.
- * Applicant must submit two letters of recommendation: One from teacher and one from community member or organization leader. Recommendations may not be from relatives.
- * The recipients shall be selected on the basis of community involvement, scholastic abilities, extracurricular activities and answers to essay questions.
- * Applicant must have a cumulative GPA of 3.00 or higher by the end of the first semester of senior year.
- * The recipient will be selected by the Chew Family Committee.

Recipient of this scholarship will be awarded \$500 in a single payment AFTER the completion of their first semester of post-secondary education. They must maintain a GPA of 2.5 during their first semester. The money will be paid directly to the student for the use of tuition, books, or living expenses. A copy of the first semester grades will be submitted to the Murray Community High School Guidance Counselor prior to opening of Spring Semester.

In the event of a student dropping out of school, providing evidence of satisfactory progress, or not demonstrating satisfactory progress, the money will be awarded to a runner-up recipient chosen by the committee members during initial application review.
